Requested Zoning By-law Amendment

To change the zoning by amending the temporary use provisions of the existing Agricultural/Temporary (AG1/T-45) Zone to extend the temporary golf driving range and accessory uses for an additional three (3) years. Changes to the currently permitted land uses and development regulations are summarized below. The complete Zoning By-law is available at <u>london.ca/planapps</u>.

Current Zoning

Zone: Agricultural/Temporary (AG1/T-45) Zone

Permitted Uses: The AG1 Zone permits agricultural uses; livestock facilities; farm dwelling; forestry uses; kennels; conservation lands; wayside pits; nursery; passive recreation use; farm market; small wind energy conversion system; and greenhouse farm. The T-45 Zone permits a golf driving range and accessory uses for a temporary period not exceeding three (3) years.

Requested Zoning

Zone: Agricultural/Temporary (AG1/T-45) Zone **Permitted Uses:** No change requested. Permitted uses as per "Permitted Uses" above. **Temporary Zone:** T-45 request for an extension to allow for a golf driving range and accessory uses for an additional three (3) years

Planning Policies

Any change to the Zoning By-law must conform to the policies of the Official Plan, London's long-range planning document. These lands are currently designated as Agriculture in the Official Plan, which permits agricultural uses as the main uses. In accordance with the Temporary Use By-laws provisions in the Official Plan, Council may pass by-laws to authorize the temporary use of land, buildings or structures for a purpose that is otherwise prohibited by this Plan, for renewable periods not exceeding three years.

The subject lands are in the Farmland Place Type in *The London Plan*, permitting a range of agricultural uses and normal farm practices. In accordance with the Temporary Use Provisions in The London Plan, Council may pass by-laws to authorize the temporary use of land, buildings or structures for a purpose that is otherwise prohibited by this Plan, for renewable periods not exceeding three years.

How Can You Participate in the Planning Process?

You have received this Notice because someone has applied to change the zoning of land located within 120 metres of a property you own, or your landlord has posted the public meeting notice in your building. The City reviews and makes decisions on such planning applications in accordance with the requirements of the *Planning Act*. If you previously provided written or verbal comments about this application, we have considered your comments as part of our review of the application and in the preparation of the planning report and recommendation to the Planning and Environment Committee. The additional ways you can participate in the City's planning review and decision making process are summarized below. The Planning and Environment Committee will make a recommendation to Council, which will make its decision at a future Council meeting.

What Are Your Legal Rights?

Notification of Council Decision

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of London on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, 300 Dufferin Ave., P.O. Box 5035, London, ON, N6A 4L9, or at <u>docservices@london.ca</u>. You will also be notified if you speak to the Planning and Environment Committee at the public meeting about this application and leave your name and address with the Secretary of the Committee.

Right to Appeal to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so.


