What is Proposed?

Zoning amendment to allow:

- A two-storey mixed use apartment complex consisting of 9 commercial units on the ground floor and 9 residential units on the second floor.
- Special provisions are requested for lot frontage and a reduction to commercial parking spaces.

Application Details

Requested Zoning By-law Amendment

A Zoning By-law Amendment is required to permit a two-storey mixed use apartment complex consisting of 9 commercial units on the ground floor and 9 residential units on the second floor. The request is for the subject lands to re-zone FROM a Residential (R3-2) & Convenience Commercial (CC3) Zone TO a Neighbourhood Shopping Area (NSA3) Zone with special provisions for a reduction of commercial parking spaces and lot frontage. Changes to the currently permitted land uses and development regulations are summarized below..

Zone: Residential R3 (R3-2) & Convenience Commercial (CC3)

<u>Permitted Uses:</u> Single-detached dwellings, semi-detached dwellings, duplex dwellings, triplex dwellings, converted dwellings, fourplex dwellings, convenience service establishments without a drive-through facility, convenience stores without a drive-through facility, financial institutions without a drive-through facility, personal service establishments without a drive-through facility, convenience stores, without a drive-through facility, with gas bars.

Height: 10.5 metres

Requested Zoning

Zone: Neighbourhood Shopping Area (NSA3)

Permitted Uses: Bake shops, catalogue shops, clinics, convenience service establishments, day care centres, duplicating shops, financial institutions, food stores, libraries, medical/dental offices, offices, personal service establishments, restaurants, retail stores, service and repair establishments, studios, video rental establishments, brewing on premises establishments, an apartment building with any or all of the other permitted uses on the first and/or second floor. **Special Provision(s):** To permit a lot frontage of 39 metres, whereas 40 metres is the minimum required, and to permit 46 commercial parking spaces, whereas 58 spaces is required.

Height: 8 Metres

Density: 54.3 Units Per Hectare

The City may also consider special provisions for minimum front yard setback, minimum exterior side yard setback, minimum landscaped open space and west and north interior side yard setbacks.

Planning Policies

Any change to the Zoning By-law must conform to the policies of the Official Plan, London's long-range planning document.

The subject lands are in the Neighbourhoods Place Type fronting an Civic Boulevard in The London Plan, permitting a broad range of residential uses including mixed-use development where two Civic Boulevards intersect (Trafalgar Street & Clarke Road).

How Can You Participate in the Planning Process?

You have received this Notice because someone has applied to change the zoning of land located within 120 metres of a property you own, or your landlord has posted the public meeting notice in your building. The City reviews and makes decisions on such planning applications in accordance with the requirements of the Planning Act. If you previously provided written or verbal comments about this application, we have considered your comments as part of our review of the application and in the preparation of the planning report and recommendation to the Planning and Environment Committee. The additional ways you can participate in the City's planning review and decision making process are summarized below.

The Planning and Environment Committee will consider the requested zoning changes at this meeting, which is required by the Planning Act. You will be invited to provide your comments at this public participation meeting. A neighbourhood or community association may exist in your area. If it reflects your views on this application, you may wish to select a representative of the association to speak on your behalf at the public participation meeting. Neighbourhood Associations are listed on the Neighbourgood website. The Planning and Environment Committee will make a recommendation to Council, which will make its decision at a future Council meeting.

What Are Your Legal Rights?

Notification of Council Decision

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the City of London on the proposed zoning by-law amendment, you must make a written request to the City Clerk, 300 Dufferin Ave., P.O. Box 5035, London, ON, N6A 4L9, or at docservices@london.ca. You will also be notified if you speak to the Planning and Environment Committee at the public meeting about this application and leave your name and address with the Clerk of the Committee.

Right to Appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal

If a person or public body would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Council of the Corporation of the City of London to the Ontario Land Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Land Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.


Notice of Collection of Personal Information


