Fireworks By-Law

The Fireworks By-Law sets out when you can sell, purchase, or discharge fireworks.





Consumer fireworks are only allowed to be set off on specific days of the year during limited hours.



Improper use of fireworks could result in serious burn injuries.



Violations of the By-law could result in fines or penalties.

Sale of Fireworks and Firecrackers

Consumer fireworks are permitted to be sold 5 days prior to:

- Victoria Day
- · Canada Day
- Diwali
- Lunar New Year

Consumer Fireworks By-Law - PW-11

Be considerate of your neighbours! Only set off fireworks:

- Between sundown and 11:00 p.m. on:
- · Victoria Day, Canada Day, Diwali and Lunar New Year)

Follow all safety precautions and always keep a water hose or pail of water close by.

Fireworks and sparklers reach extreme temperatures and can cause serious personal injury or a fire.

If someone is burned, run cool water over the burn for approximately 3 to 5 minutes and seek medical attention if necessary.

No one under the age of 18 is allowed to discharge fireworks unless they are being directly supervised and under the control of an adult 18 years or older.
