Draft Road Projects


Strategic road projects are being proposed to manage congestion, support population growth and economic development and to further opportunities for implementing a network of complete streets. The road projects will:

- Expand capacity for people and goods movement
- Upgrade corridors with new infrastructure like curbs, streetlights and sidewalks

what we heard

Londoners feel it can be unsafe to walk, bike, and access bus stops, especially in close proximity to cars on busy streets.

Improved connectivity and emergency response operations.




Improved road safety

Supports local deliveries and goods movement.




Draft Policies and Actions - Roads






Implement roundabouts to improve safety and traffic flow and reduce long-term operations and maintenance costs.



Improve how curb space is managed for mobility, access, delivery services, and placemaking purposes.



Create a new Road Safety Action Plan and regularly assess progress towards London's Vision Zero goals.



Apply Equity and Climate Emergency Screening Tool to major transportation projects.








Draft Road Projects

The Mobility Master Plan is recommending road projects that add capacity and improve traffic flow to better manage congestion and advance the implementation of sidewalks and bike facilities in areas lacking this essential infrastructure.

- All road users will benefit with complete streets upgrades as road projects are implemented.
- Supports regional connectivity, the movement of goods, housing and growth.
- Projects can improve quality of life for some neighborhoods by reducing cut-through traffic and improving emergency response times.
- Improved connectivity to mobility hubs supports multi-modal trips and inter-regional travel including the **27.6 Million trips** into and out of the city per year (source: Google Insights Explorer)
