Support for Immigrants, Refugees, and Newcomers

If you or someone you know is at immediate risk of self-harm or harming others, call 911 or go to a hospital emergency department. You will be cared for even if you are not insured. If uninsured, you will be billed later.

Besides this guide, other ways to learn about less urgent mental health services are to ask your community support agency, a family doctor or walk-in clinic about what services are available.

Helpful Information About Mental Health Services in Canada

In general:

- The services in this resource are mostly free unless noted as requiring payment.
- Advanced support such as seeing a Psychiatrist or being admitted to hospital may be arranged and will likely require health insurance (provincial, federal or private).
- Psychotherapist services and counselling may not be covered by provincial or federal health insurance. They may be covered by employee group benefits.
- If you are unsure if a service is free or if you are covered by insurance to use it, call ahead to find out.
- If you don't have insurance or benefits to cover a service, you can pay yourself.
- A psychiatrist is a medical doctor who can diagnose and prescribe medications to treat mental health disorders.
- A psychologist holds a master's and/or doctoral degree in psychology. They can assess, diagnose, and treat people with various mental health conditions without prescribing medications.

- A psychotherapist, or therapist, is a trained professional who uses talk therapy to treat people with various mental health conditions.
- With many services, you don't have to have an assessment but can just talk to someone until you feel better or to make a plan for more care.
- With the exception of emergency services, including emergency phone supports, interpretation usually needs to be arranged in advance.

Confidentiality in Canada:

Confidentiality is a legal obligation not to disclose information obtained in confidence without the patient's consent.

- People 16 and over can expect confidentiality at clinics and hospitals.
- Some services will provide confidential care to people under 16, but you should confirm this prior to service being provided.
- Age of consent in schools is 18 so parents may be asked for permission for a particular kind of assessment or treatment.

Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA) Thames Valley Addiction and Mental Health Services is an integrated mental health and addiction agency providing community-based supports and services to individuals aged 12 and up across Elgin, Middlesex, and Oxford Counties. The continuum of services includes crisis intervention and virtual supports, mobile crisis teams, police partnerships, case management, counselling, and community wellness programs for both individuals and their families. Housing supports and addiction medicine services are also available. Treatment and service plans are developed based on standardized screening and assessment protocols and procedures. The organization was established in April 2021 when three organizations (Addiction Services of Thames Valley, CMHA Elgin-Middlesex, and CMHA Oxford) united to better serve the mental health and addiction needs of the Thames Valley Region. It is guided by its vision “resilience for all through positive mental health and freedom from addiction”.
