# **Recycling DON'Ts**

Paper: Unbagged shredded paper, waxed or foiled paper & boxes, construction paper, gift wrap, photos or wood

Glass: Broken glass, dishes, drinking glasses, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, window panes

Plastic: All wraps, films, packaging, bags, pouches, cutlery, Styrofoam™, foam packaging, hangers, toys, dishes, coffee pods

Metal: Hangers, pots & pans, appliances

Other: Hazardous & Special Products (see back), all medical waste, wooden food crates

### Recyclables in these containers will NOT be collected:









# **Hazardous and Special Products (HSP)** Iondon.ca/hsp

HSP is any waste that might be flammable, corrosive, toxic, or explosive and does not belong in regular garbage or recycling.


Businesses may dispose of small quantities of HSP at the Depot for no charge but must complete a Small Quantity Exemption form.

IMPORTANT Starting January 1, 2026, as per provincial government regulation, the City of London will no longer be responsible for the Blue Box Program. The program will be managed by Circular Materials, a national non-profit organization, that focuses only on materials collected from households.

As of September 1, 2025, it is not known if small business recycling services will continue to be available or funded by the City of London in 2026. Updates will be posted on London.ca/recycle.

# **Business Curbside Collection**

# Eligible business can receive weekly garbage collection.

### All garbage must be bagged for collection.

- Maximum weight for a bag is 20 kg (44 lbs).
- Maximum size is 125 L.
- Maximum 12 bags per collection.
- Loose items or open bags will not be collected.
- Garbage in cans will not be collected.
- All mirrors, glass, or sharp items must be sealed separately in cardboard and labeled 'caution sharps' for collection.

  Caution Sharps

Place garbage or recycling to curb by 7 a.m. on collection day, but not before 6 p.m. the night before.

Scavengers and animals may rip open bags left out overnight, making them uncollectable. Setting out bags in the morning before 7a.m. can prevent scavenging.

**Please keep collectors safe** by placing waste on level ground, within 1 m of the curb and not on snowbanks.

**Trade waste** such as wooden pallets, discarded inventory, equipment and machine parts are not collectable at the curb.
