- **Traditional** – The provision of arena operations is a traditional municipal function.

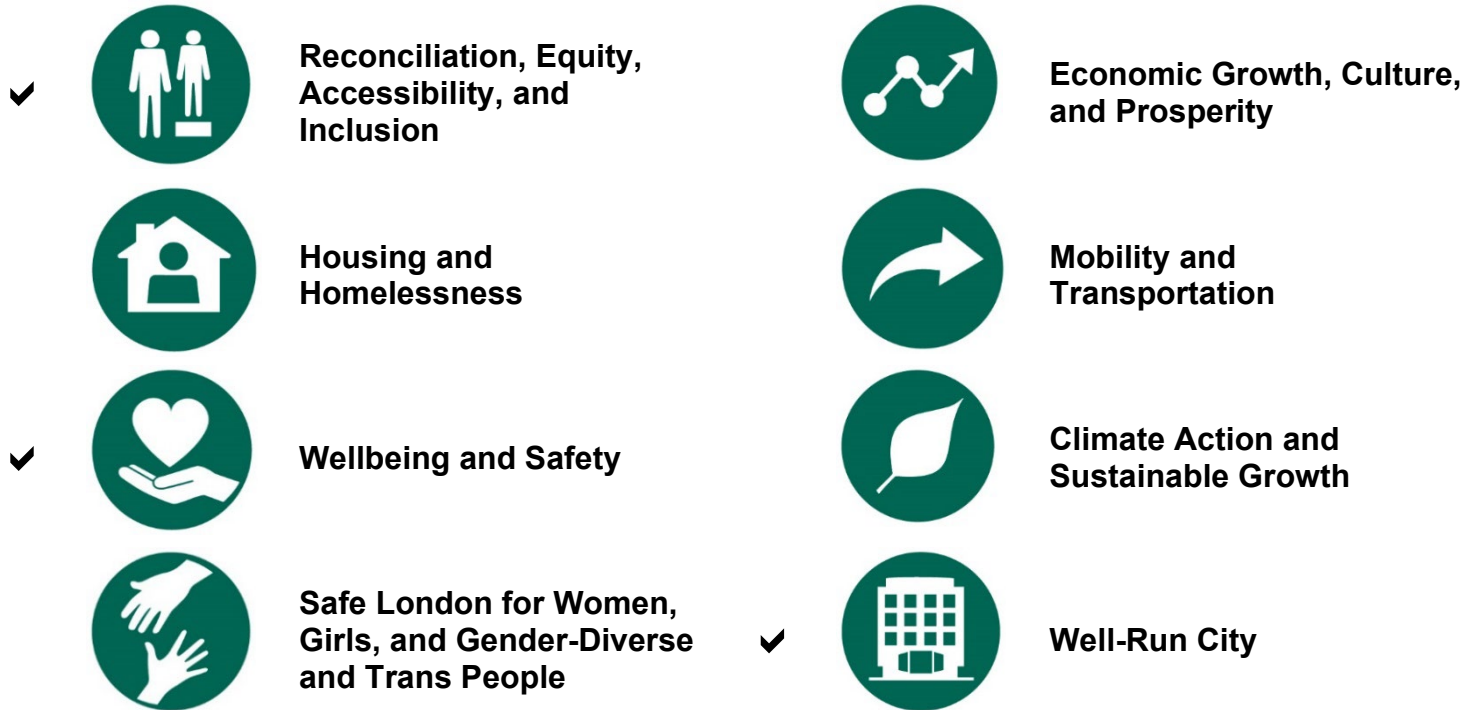

• Environmental:

- Arenas is incorporating industry smart setting systems to reduce energy consumption while still maintaining ice quality.
- Arenas will continue to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from existing sources and avoid increased emissions from a new service or asset by using zero emissions technology.
- Arenas operates all electric ice resurfacers and will continue the transition to all electric equipment.

- Arenas continues to work towards being barrier free and inclusive by remaining AODA compliant.
- Arenas remove barriers to access for skating rinks with free programming and municipal subsidy.

Governance:

- Arenas have enhanced Health & Safety and Risk Management procedures in place to mitigate risks by adhering to legislative requirements.
